<p>■ <b>Peter (Driver)</b> Bold leader. Struggles: impulsive, denial. Growth: Pentecost preaching; accepts Gentiles.</p>	<p>■ <b>Matthew (Analytical)</b> Detail-oriented. Struggles: materialism. Growth: leaves wealth; writes Gospel.</p>
<p>■ <b>James Z. (Driver)</b> Ambitious. Struggles: pride, anger. Growth: martyrdom; submission.</p>	<p>■ <b>Thomas (Analytical)</b> Needs proof. Struggles: doubt. Growth: declares Christ; missionary.</p>
<p>■ <b>John (Expressive)</b> Relational. Struggles: pride, exclusivity. Growth: teaches love; stays at cross.</p>	<p>■ <b>James A. (Supportive)</b> Quiet servant. Struggles: unseen. Growth: steady faithfulness.</p>
<p>■ <b>Andrew (Supportive)</b> Brings others. Struggles: quiet, background. Growth: faithful service.</p>	<p>■ <b>Thaddaeus (Supportive)</b> Thoughtful. Struggles: hesitation. Growth: asks; remains faithful.</p>
<p>■ <b>Philip (Analytical)</b> Logical. Struggles: doubt, overthinking. Growth: evangelizes; faith grows.</p>	<p>■ <b>Simon Z. (Driver)</b> Zealous. Struggles: intensity. Growth: unity with others.</p>
<p>■ <b>Nathanael (Analytical)</b> Honest thinker. Struggles: skepticism, bluntness. Growth: follows faithfully.</p>	<p>■ <b>Judas (Driver*)</b> Wanted the ministry to move faster, even trying to force it with his own hands.. Struggles: greed, betrayal. Growth: remorse (tragic).</p>
